

STUDENT HOUSING AT UC DAVIS

UC Davis offers three residence hall areas, primarily to single undergraduate freshmen: Segundo, Tercero and Cuarto. Located in three geographical areas of the campus, all are close to classes, laboratories, libraries, recreational facilities, shopping and campus resources. Segundo is on the northwest edge of campus (four five-story high rises and ten two- and three-story buildings). Tercero is located mid-campus (two four-story buildings, twelve three-story buildings and six two-story buildings). Cuarto is located one block from the northern boundary of campus (four separate complexes with two- and three-story buildings).

Each community develops a distinct personality of its own, and residents work together to develop a variety of educational, social and recreational programs. Residence hall specialty programs allow students to focus on a particular interest or theme and enjoy activities unique to the community. Some programs offer an academic theme component with a one-unit seminar. Residential living-learning communities are an option for students participating in one of our campus-wide honors programs.

ON-CAMPUS HOUSING DEADLINES

The campus is delighted to guarantee a contract offer for university on-campus residence hall housing to all freshmen entering during the fall quarter who turn in their Statement of Intent to Register (SIR) by the published deadline. For winter and spring quarters, contracts are offered to freshmen on a space-available basis.

Transfer students who turn in their Statement of Intent to Register (SIR) by the published deadline are offered residence hall contracts on a space-available basis. Transfer students interested in living on campus are encouraged to visit housing.ucdavis.edu and refer to the *Transfer Student Housing* one-pager.

FACTS, FIGURES, FURNISHINGS

All residence halls have certain common features: study spaces, laundry rooms, kitchenettes and lounges. All rooms have one telephone line. A brochure containing information about establishing phone service is provided to all students. Direct Internet access and basic cable television viewing is available to each student living in the residence halls. In addition, there are Computer Centers in Segundo, Tercero, and Cuarto for residence hall students. UC Davis residence halls are all non-smoking environments.

Each resident's space is furnished with a twin bed (regular length, 75", or extra long, 80"), desk, chair, chest of drawers, study lamp and a wastebasket. Each room contains window coverings and bookshelves. Six-hundred-watt (600) microwaves and 4.5 cubic foot refrigerators can be kept in the residence halls.

Triple rooms, double rooms and single rooms are available. Two-thirds of all residence halls spaces are made up of double rooms. Triple rooms are available for those students who are interested in reducing their housing costs.

The housing contract covers room and meals for the entire academic year. A meal-only or room-only option is not available. Students may select from eight meal plan options designed to provide students with maximum flexibility. Meal plans range from 7-8 meals weekly to 16-17 meals weekly.

The Colleges at LaRue (530) 754-5797, Primero Grove (530) 754-8455, and the Atriums (530) 753-0659 offer other housing options on campus. All three facilities are privately managed complexes built on university land.
