ACADEMIC PROGRAMS AVAILABLE AT UC DAVIS

UC Davis has four undergraduate colleges: Agricultural and Environmental Sciences (CAES), Biological Sciences, Engineering and Letters and Science (L&S); a graduate studies division; and professional schools in education, law, management, medicine, and veterinary medicine. Undergraduate major and graduate programs in CAES and L&S are organized into six divisions: Agricultural Sciences (CAES), Environmental Sciences (CAES), Human Sciences (CAES), Humanities, Arts and Cultural Studies (L&S), Math and Physical Sciences (L&S) and Social Sciences (L&S).

HOW TO APPLY

- Visit admissions.ucdavis.edu to review undergraduate admission requirements. If you are currently attending a California community college, talk to your adviser about the UC Davis Transfer Admission Guarantee (TAG) program.
- Meet or talk with an adviser to explore or declare an academic major.
- Complete and file an undergraduate application by the deadline. Describe any special circumstances in your application essay. For graduate admission, obtain an "Application for Graduate Admission and Fellowship" from Graduate Studies. Review all requirements and file a completed application by the specified deadline.
- Obtain and file applications for financial aid and scholarships by the specified deadlines.
- Communicate with the department or graduate group for specific requirements of your prospective program.
- Take the Graduate Record Examination (GRE) or Graduate Management Aptitude Test (GMAT) if required by your program.
